- ⇒ To ensure that high quality mentoring and support is available for those who need it most and are at risk of becoming disengaged from education



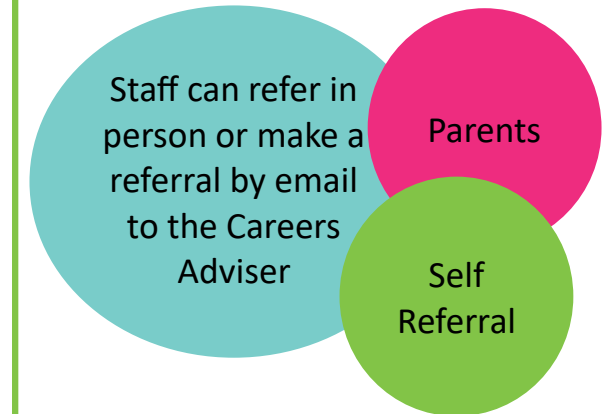

How students are supported

- ⇒ High quality student focused mentoring
- ⇒ One to one careers meetings
- ⇒ Information, advice and guidance on a range of options for the future
- ⇒ Liaising with learning providers, employers and working closely with other professionals on behalf of students

- ⇒ Talking to groups of young people with similar interests or the same decisions to make
- ⇒ Support with work experience

Referral Process



- ⇒ Year 11 students are entitled to a one to one careers guidance appointment
- ⇒ Students from all years can request an appointment or can be referred for support

Open Door Policy

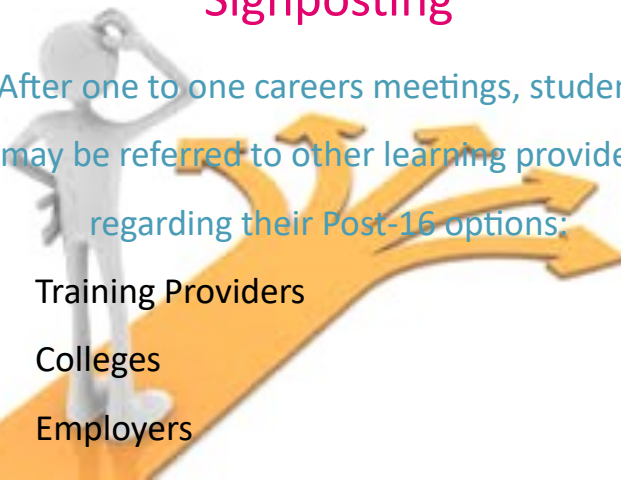
All students can access advice and guidance when they need it during drop-in sessions at break-times.
