Having a qualification in Drama can lead to many further courses and careers. Examples of the many careers within performing arts include actor, front of house managers, wardrobe manager, stage technician, film producer, drama therapist, scriptwriter. However, you can also use the many transferable skills developed and highly valued in workplaces in areas such as law, teaching, business, marketing, customer service and retail.
